#### SPECIAL EDITORIAL MESSAGE

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

September tested our nation in ways few could have imagined. The GenZ movement, born from the youth's outcry against corruption and injustice, left scars that will remain in our collective memory for years to come. Lives were lost, dreams were shattered, and institutions were shaken. What Nepal endured on those dark days was more than just chaos — it was a reckoning.

Yet, even in the midst of despair, the true spirit of Rotary "Service Above Self" shone through. The theme of this year, "Unite for Good," was not just words on a pin - it became a living, breathing action. As hospitals struggled with blood shortages, communities faced insecurity, and basic services were disrupted, we Rotary Action Group, a group of 13 Presidents from Rotary International District 3292 chose not to watch but to act. We acted swiftly — organizing emergency blood donation drives, restoring police posts, supporting health workers, and reviving essential infrastructure for security forces.

Together with 13 fellow presidents, our Presidents' Rotary Action Group mobilized swiftly — collecting lifesaving blood, restoring destroyed police posts, supporting health workers, and even reviving essential infrastructure like water supply for security forces. These acts, though small in the scale of the nation's grief, carried with them a message of resilience: when society falters, service must stand tall.

As President of the Rotary Club of Matribhumi Baluwatar, I could not be prouder of how our club and our Rotary family responded. Team RCMB is a proud member of the Presidents' Rotary Action Group of RI District 3292, standing shoulder-toshoulder in this united effort. While September is known as Basic Education and Literacy Month, we chose to redirect our focus to where it was needed most immediate humanitarian relief.

> This month reminded us that leadership is not about routine, but about response. It is not about comfort, but about courage. And above all, it is about standing united when it matters most.

> Let us carry forward the lessons of September with humility, hope, and a renewed determination to truly "Unite for Good.

## **Standing with Corruption Free Nepal**

#### **This**

September brought one of the the darkest chapters in Nepal's recent history. On September 8 and 9, the GenZ protest movement—sparked by nationwide demands against corruption and injustice—shook the entire country. The aftermath was devastating: lives were lost, hundreds were injured, and countless families were left grieving. In just days, Nepal saw police stations, administrative courts, schools, shopping centers, and even private homes of leaders engulfed in flames. The nation lost assets worth millions. and the spirit of its youth bore the heaviest burden.

Amid this crisis. the existing government collapsed, paving the way for the formation of a new administration. Yet, in the shadow of this "black day," hope for a better Nepal emerged. At Rotary Club of Matribhumi Baluwatar, we paused to pray for the departed souls, healing for the injured, and brighter days ahead for the nation.





#### **Emergency Blood Collection: A United Rotary Response**

Sept 9, 2025 | Balaju Chowk

The morning after the protests, hospitals across Kathmandu faced an acute blood shortage. Rising to the urgency, the Presidents' Rotary Action Group—a coalition of 13 club presidents from Rotary International District 3292, including RCMB—mobilized an immediate humanitarian response.

On September 10, an emergency blood donation camp was organized at Balaju Chowk, where 74 pints of blood were collected within hours. This life-saving effort marked the beginning of a series of relief initiatives led jointly by the presidents' group.













#### **Extending Humanitarian Relief Services**

Relief efforts did not stop at blood collection. Together, we extended humanitarian support to communities and individuals most in need:

Medical & Hospital Support:
 Assisting injured individuals
 with hospital arrangements,
 medicines, and safe transport

Food & Supplies Distribution:

back to their homes.

Providing meals to frontline health workers and delivering essential supplies to families affected by the violence.

Personal Assistance: Club members
 personally reached out, ensuring dignity and
 care for those most vulnerable.













#### **Restoring Security and Social Confidence**



As law and order broke down—thousands of prisoners escaping and many police and traffic posts destroyed—communities were left anxious and insecure. Recognizing that security is the foundation of social stability, the Presidents' Rotary Action Group prioritized rebuilding police and traffic stations.







- Basundhara Police Division: Relief began with a cleaning and restoration campaign. Local residents soon joined, and together, the Chauki was rebuilt even better than before.
- Thapathali Traffic Division: We, the group restored the station with a cleaning and refurbishment campaign and provided 15 full bedding sets (blankets, pillows, bedsheets, and dasna) for officers who had lost their sleeping quarters to the fire.
- **Dharmasthali Police Division:** To restart immediate service delivery, we handed over computer sets and a printer.









#### **Supporting Vital Infrastructure**

#### Restoring Water Supply for Security Personnel at Baggikhana

The destruction caused by the GenZ protests left behind more than damaged buildings—it disrupted basic services that many rely on. At Baggikhana, nearly 400 police and traffic personnel were left struggling after their water supply and filtration plant was completely destroyed, leaving them without access to clean drinking water at a time when their responsibilities were most critical.

Understanding the urgency, the Presidents' Rotary Action Group, with generous financial support from Rotary International District 3292, stepped forward to address this challenge. Swift restoration efforts were carried out, and the water plant was successfully repaired and officially handed over to the security

This initiative not only met the immediate needs of frontline personnel but also reflected Rotary's commitment to stand with communities in moments of hardship. By ensuring dignity, health, and basic living conditions, Rotary once again demonstrated the spirit of "Service Above Self" and truly embodied this year's theme—Unite for Good.















#### Rotary in Action: Living the Theme "Unite for Good"

While September is traditionally celebrated as Basic Education and Literacy Month in Rota Calender, RCMB set aside all scheduled activities to respond to the nation's urgent needs and united with its team - Rotary Action Group for immediate call of humanitarian relief.

In one of the most trying times for Nepal, Rotary once again proved that service knows no pause. Guided by our theme, "Unite for Good," the 13 presidents of Rotary International District 3292 stood together—restoring hope, rebuilding trust, and reaffirming that Rotary's essence is always Service Above Self.





We know that no matter how heavy the storm, the sun must rise again. Even amidst pain and loss, life teaches us that smiles must return, joy must be shared, and fellowship must continue. With that spirit, after the dark days of September, Rotary reminded us to gather, to celebrate, and to keep hope alive through fellowship and service—embracing togetherness, happiness, and the Rotary spirit that not only keeps us moving forward but also re-energizes us to serve again.










## **Virtual Regular Meeting**




Sept 10, 2025 | Google Meet


## **Rotary UN International Day of Peace Celebration**




Candlelight Vigil


